At the time, her family did not have medical or dental insurance and her mother really needed medical and dental care, so she was referred to our St. Raphael Dental Clinic and Virgil Gianelli Medical Clinic to receive services, free of charge, which was a huge burden lifted off of her family. Alma mentioned that her mother is the glue that holds the family together, so for her to get the necessary services to care for her health at the time, was a tremendous help.

Years later, this past July, we met Alma again. She was part of a program called Decision Medicine with which St. Mary's Dining Room works closely with, annually. Decision Medicine encourages high achieving and under-represented students, to consider a career in medicine and eventually to return to serve our community. Alma and her colleagues volunteered in our various departments, such as our Kitchen and Hygiene Center.

As their day with us concluded, Alma decided to graciously donate to St. Mary's Dining Room. She mentioned that we helped her mother a while ago and said that "Coming to St. Mary's changed my view." She was "astonished" by the services we offer.

Alma has high expectations for herself because of her parents. It is her goal to become a cardiac surgeon one day, a surgeon that serves her home community of Stockton.
